And A Word From Fr. Martin, Our Parish Priest

Today we have a great occasion to celebrate -40 years since our beautiful Church was built.

As I have been preparing for this day, I am filled with a deep sense of gratitude to the people who worked so hard forty years ago to make our Church building a reality. In particular, I am thankful to Canon Joseph Maxwell for having the vision not only to build us a Church building that always reminds us of God but also a Church that has stood the test of time.

For today we are celebrating in at least two ways: the Church building; and the Parish Community.

The Church building – 40 years old today - is indeed wonderful with its many features that catch the eye. The stained glass windows tell us God's story – through Creation to Resurrection, along with the Baptismal window and the window of our patron saint, John the Evangelist. On top of that we have an ornate Baptismal font recalling the words of the psalm 'as a deer longs for running streams, so longs my soul for you, O Lord'. And of course, the central focus of our Church has always been the lectern and the altar reminding us of the two central parts of each Mass, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
